Missionaries in “Modern Rome”

Established in 1995, the D. James Kennedy Center for Christian Statesmanship is a spiritually-based outreach to men and women in positions of influence and authority in our nation's government. Our mission is to support, equip, and empower Christian statesmanship and inspire the next generation of Christian leaders to serve God and man in the halls of government.

Our founder, D. James Kennedy, had the vision to send missionaries into the “modern Rome” of our day. We do this by resourcing and equipping elected officials, their staff, and lay people eager to serve in the public square.

The D. James Kennedy Center for Christian Statesmanship serves representatives, senators, staffers, and interns through evangelism, Bible study, worldview and policy briefing, and leadership training.

What is a Christian Statesman?

A Christian Statesman is a man or woman whose life is governed by bedrock principles over which they will not compromise for personal or political gain.

A Christian Statesman is a person whose commitment to Christ and love of country compels them to stand for truth and righteousness in government.

A Christian Statesman recognizes that public service is a high calling – a ministry ordained by God (Romans 13:4) – and that they will one day render an account to God for that service. In short, a Christian Statesman is a person who fears God more than men.

A Christian Statesman endeavors to live out their Christian faith in public life, upholding those principles that exalt rather than debase the nation. Such persons live their lives guided by a Christian worldview, which acknowledges the sovereignty of God and compels them to make their life count for the kingdom of Christ.

We Believe the Bible Speaks to All of Life

Christians are called to engage and transform culture for the sake of His kingdom. Christ's lordship is not limited to our morning devotions and church attendance. It should influence our interactions in every sphere of culture—art, science, education, business, sports, entertainment – and even politics. As the great Dutch political leader and culture influencer Abraham Kuyper once said, "There is not a square inch in the whole domain of our human existence over which Christ, who is Sovereign over all, does not cry, 'Mine!'"

With this in mind, we must have individuals in positions of government who are guided by their faith in Jesus Christ and committed to living out His teachings in both personal and public life. In a world that is increasingly secular and hostile to the message of the gospel, it is more important than ever that we have Christian statesmen who are not afraid to stand up for the truths of the Gospel and to be a voice for righteousness in the public square. Distinguished Christian statesmen serve as shining examples of what it means to live a life of faith, integrity, and service to others. They provide a powerful witness to the gospel's transformative power.

The United States was built on a Judeo-Christian foundation, and we must continue to uphold this legacy and the values it represents. Dr. D. James Kennedy, our late Founder and mentor, once said, "the purpose of the Christian life is to glorify God and enjoy Him forever." This principle should also be true for those seeking to serve in government. A Christian statesman seeks to serve the common good and promote justice and righteousness, always guided by their faith in Jesus Christ.

In addition to the importance of having Christian statesmen leading our country today, it is vital that we preserve religious liberty in our nation. The United States' founding fathers recognized the importance of religious freedom and enshrined it as a fundamental right in the First Amendment to the Constitution. This right is important not only for Christians but for all people of faith who seek to live out their beliefs in the public square.

Just as politics seems to permeate all things, the Center for Christian Statesmanship believes the Bible speaks to all of life, including our culture and politics.



What Does the Center for Christian Statesmanship Do?

The D. James Kennedy Center for Christian Statesmanship seeks to equip a new generation of leaders for service to both God and country through a wide range of ministry activities, including:

"Politics and Principle" luncheons at which Christian Members of Congress share their faith testimony

Special intern and staffer events, such as barbecues and Bible studies, where 20 and 30 year olds gather for Christian community

Lectures and panel events where Christian thought leaders apply a biblical worldview to public policy and share their Christian witness to the Capitol Hill community

them, He will continue to secure the blessings of liberty for generations to come.

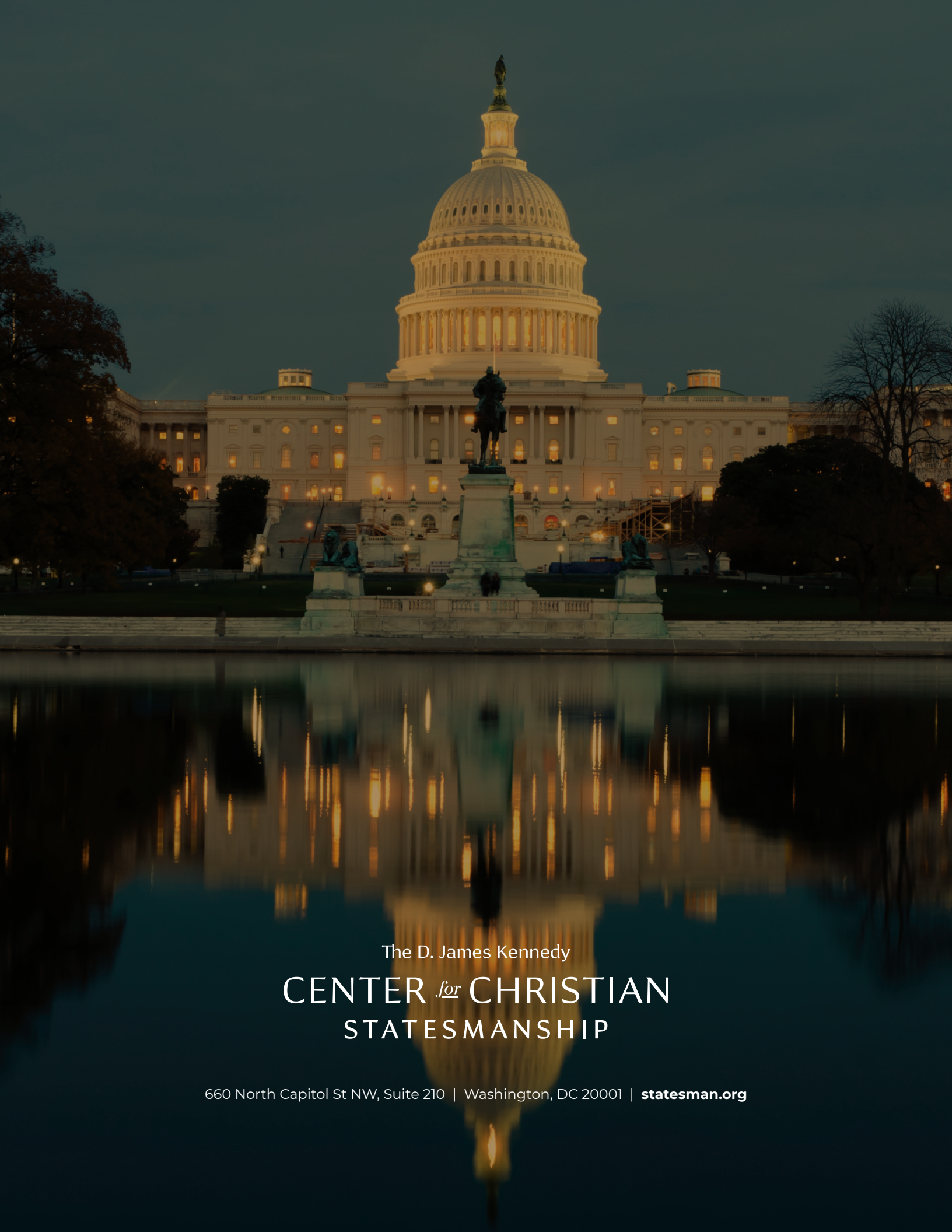
